

"So be perfect, just as your heavenly Father is perfect." Talk about setting the bar high!

This verse, at the end of today's Gospel passage from Matthew, sets the tone for all of the readings this week. In embracing stewardship as a way of life, we have a custom-made plan that, with a big dose of God's grace, will move us towards the holiness of life to which Christ is calling us in this

Our first reading, from Leviticus, lays out this theme immediately, as God instructs Moses to tell the whole community to, "Be holy, for I, the Lord, your God, am holy." The call to holiness is for everyone because every one of us is made in the image and likeness of an all-holy God. This call

should therefore not seem strange or unattainable — on the contrary, it is a call to become our truest selves. And even in this ancient passage, we find practical instruction in how to begin to attain holiness: "You shall love your neighbor as yourself. I am the Lord."

The first few verses of our second reading from Corinthians give a further reminder as to why we must live holy lives with this thought-provoking question, "Do you not know that you are the temple of God, and that the Spirit of God dwells in you?" What great dignity we have as God's own dwelling place. And what encouragement this should bring us the call to holiness is possible because we have the Holy Spirit dwelling right within us!

The following verses from this passage show us that a life of holiness will not make sense in worldly terms, however. "If any one among you considers himself wise in this age, let him become a fool, so as to become wise. For the wisdom of this world is foolishness in the eyes of God." The stewardship way of life, giving away the best of our time, our talents and treasure to God for His glory and for the sake of others, is the path to holiness. Yet, it appears utterly foolish in the eyes of many.

In our Gospel passage from Matthew, our Lord takes this "foolish" concept even further with these illustrations of how we should give of ourselves and our things: "When someone strikes you on your right cheek, turn the other one as well. If anyone wants to go to law with you over your tunic, hand over your cloak as well. Should anyone press you into service for one mile, go for two miles." And further still: "love your enemies and pray for those who persecute you." Jesus teaches that this is the kind of action and attitude that will make us "children of [our] Heavenly Father." This is the high bar of holiness to which our Lord is calling us.

If your lifestyle and your priorities look a little foolish to the world around you, know that you're probably doing it right in God's eyes. At the same time, you will be filled with a peace that the world around you desperately needs. And your stewardship way of life may just draw those around you to the heavenly Father and a life of holiness, too. So, with God's grace and the Holy Spirit dwelling in us, we can confidently press on in the stewardship way of life, aiming to be perfect as our heavenly Father is perfect. Our all-holy God desires it and deserves nothing less.





I hate to say it but I think we have to move on from our "favorite Bible Verses."

There are still more. In fact, I'm still getting a response or two each week... Keep 'em coming...

I'll look at them and who knows—we may continue this thread at a later date.

I'll leave you with this one last verse. A parishioner said he uses it whenever a Christian or Pseudo-Christian "Missionary" comes to his door...

He asks if they have a bible (they always do). He asks them to read from Matthew 16:18, "... you are Peter, and upon this rock I will build my church..." Then, he will ask them to read it again... and then will finally ask them 'how many churches did Jesus build?' the answer, of course, is ONE.

Which church is built on the foundation of Rock / Peter?? Needless to say... they (missionaries) don't like to hear or talk about this passage. Thanks Fernando... Once again... If you don't have one (or several) special verses that 'speak to you,' I invite you to read and search for your 'special' verse(s). But... to begin / continue our Lenten journey..

It seems around this time of year there is always some confusion about the Lenten requirements concerning Fast and Abstinence... in fact I've already been asked about it several times. So, I thought I'd go ahead and lay it all out EXACTLY how it is... **Officially**:

It is a traditional doctrine of Christian spirituality that an essential part of repentance - turning away from sin and back to God - includes some form of penance, without which the Christian is unlikely to remain on the narrow path and be saved. Christ Himself said that His disciples would fast once He had departed.

The 1983 Code of Canon Law specifies the obligations of Latin-Right Catholics.

Canon 1250 states: Fridays, throughout the year, are penitential days throughout the entire church.

Canon 1251 states: Abstinence from eating meat or another food according to the prescriptions of the Conference of Bishops is to be observed on Fridays unless they are solemnities.

Abstinence and fast are to be observed on Ash Wednesday and on the Friday of the Passion and Death of Our Lord Jesus Christ (Good Friday).

Canon 1252 states: All persons are bound by the Law of Abstinence beginning with their 14th birthday - for life, and all adults are bound by the Law of Fast beginning with their 18th birthday until their 59th birthday (i.e. the beginning of their 60th year). Pastors and parents are to see to it that minors not bound by these laws are educated in an authentic sense of penance.

Canon 1253: Gives the Conference of Bishops authority to determine more precisely the observance of fast and abstinence and to substitute in whole or in part other forms of penance, especially works of charity and exercises of piety.

Abstinence: The law of abstinence requires a Catholic to abstain from eating meat on Fridays in honor of the Passion of Jesus on Good Friday. Meat is considered to be the flesh and organs of mammals and foul. Also forbidden are soups or gravies made from them. Salt and freshwater fish, amphibians, reptiles and shellfish are permitted, as are animal-derived products such as margarine and gelatin, which do not have any meat taste.

During Lent... Abstinence from meat on Fridays is obligatory.

Outside of Lent the U.S. Bishops Conference obtained permission from the Holy See for U.S. Catholics to substitute a penitential, or charitable, practice of their own choosing. If a person does not substitute this penitential / charitable practice... Abstinence from meat is still the norm.

Fasting: Requires a Catholic to reduce the amount of food eaten from their normal. The Church defines this as one main / regular meal a day and 2 smaller meals (which if added together would not equal the main meal in quantity). *Fasting is obligatory on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday*. The fast is broken by eating between meals and by drinks which could be considered food (milk shakes, but not milk).

Exemptions from Fast or Abstinence: Besides outside the age limits... those of unsound mind, the sick (diabetics must maintain sugar levels, etc.), the frail, pregnant or nursing women... according to need for meat or nourishment, manual laborers, guests at a meal who cannot excuse themselves without giving offense and other situations of moral or physical impossibility to observe these penitential disciplines are exempt of these requirements. Before all else we are obliged to perform the duties of our state in life. Any deprivation that would seriously hinder us in carrying out our work – as students, employees, parents etc. would be contrary to the will of God.
